COMEDY

BIG MOUTH

There's a great subreddit called "Blunder Years" where people post old, cringey photos of themselves as teenagers or young adults. Comedians Nick Kroll and John Mulaney essentially took that idea and created one of the funniest cartoons we've seen with Big Mouth. Debuting in 2017, Big Mouth just released Season Five last fall, and it follows a group of friends navigating their journey through puberty. We know, it sounds a little odd. But, we feel you'll get quite the kick out of this show for the jokes as well as the deeper meaning. Vox's Caroline Framke noted "If Big Mouth were just a series of jokes about how weird and gross puberty is, it wouldn't be much more than a decent way to kill some time during a slow weekend. But the show achieves a new, deeper level of comedy by remaining hyper aware of the fact that puberty isn't just about bodies changing, but about what it means to grow up at all."





DRAMA/THRILLER

INVENTING ANNA

If you're still as obsessed with watching people get scammed out of money as we are, then you'll enjoy Netflix's next con-woman of the week, Anna Delvey. The thrilling limited series, Inventing Anna, is based on the true story of a New York socialite and business woman who claims to be a German heiress with a huge trust fund. The story gained attention in 2018 when a real journalist (Jessica Pressler) published the article for New York Magazine. The show covers both the journalist's perspective of the alleged scammer and her journey to getting the perfect story, as well as the social manipulation of Anna Delvey (played by Ozark's Julia Garner). MINDHUNTER

If you're one for a series that'll get the heart pumping, check out Mindhunter. This Netflix original may be fictional, but it's based on real accounts involving some of the most vicious killers in American History. Holden Ford (played by Jonathan Groff) and Bill Tench (played by Holt McCallany) are members of an FBI task force created to profile serial killers. Roger Ebert dot com's Brian Tallerico said it best: "once again, Mindhunter is as tight as television gets in terms of craft. . . the interview scenes are so vibrant—and often based on real interviews—that we can sense the danger even more strongly than if the show tried to bring it to life with actors." Trigger warning — there is graphic violence in this program.



MONEY HEIST

One of our favorite shows of all time is the Spanish hit, Money Heist (La Casa De Papel). The show can be watched with English subtitles or dubbing (which isn't so bad after Season One). The show is even better when binged and you're in luck because all five seasons are on Netflix. Money Heist will give you an adrenaline rush as you find yourself routing for the charismatic, red-suited bank robbers hoping to complete an insanely-complicated heist. ARCHIVE 81

Archive 81 is the creepy distraction we all need right now. The unique series takes us through eight episodes of suspense as it bounces back and forth between two intertwined stories. Dan (Mamoudou Athie) is hired to fix burned tapes in an abandoned bunker and is immediately captivated by the video content involving Melody's (Dina Shihabi) chilling cult-ish experiences at an old apartment complex in New York. This show is different from others in the horror genre – more freaky, odd, and strange rather than gruesome or gorey. The easily "bingable" Archive 81 will get your heart racing with unexpected twists and ultimately leave you wanting more at the end of each episode! 
QUEER EYE: MORE THAN A MAKEOVER
